



# DIVISION OF EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY AND ACCESS

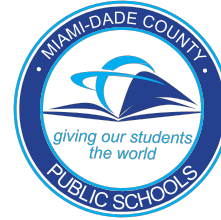
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The mission of the Division of Educational Opportunity and Access is to provide an environment for all students to become responsible, productive citizens, lifelong learners and positive contributors to society. The students in alternative schools and programs are at risk of dropping out of school and typically have a history of failure. Our schools are designed to enable the students to change that pattern of failure and go on to successful performance in traditional settings upon return to the school of residence.

## NEW PROGRAMS

### ONE STOP EDUCATIONAL AND COMMUNITY SERVICE CENTER

The One Stop Educational & Community Service Center represents a partnership between the Juvenile Justice System and Miami Dade County Public Schools (MDCPS) as well as several community partners to provide transitional services assisting adjudicated students in their transition back to educational settings and wrap around services for families in need at three (3) locations.

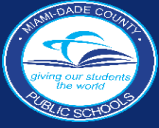

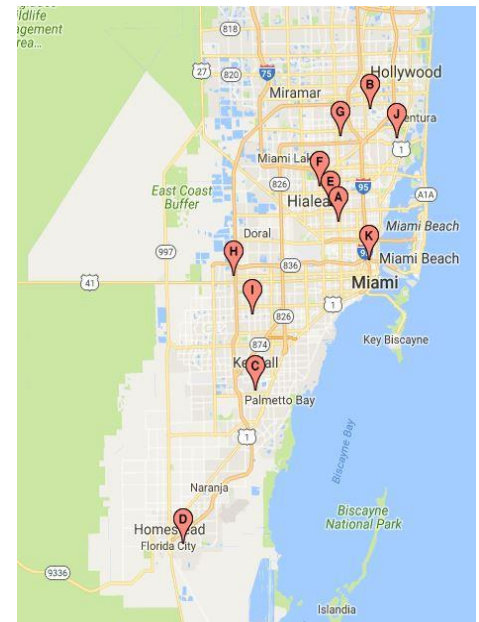

## 2016-17 Student Success Center Enhancements

### Student Success Center Updates

#### **Locations:** 11

- (1) New SSC – Overtown Youth Center

#### **Transportation Stops:**

- Over 250 bus stops for students referred throughout the district.
- Students in need of transportation will receive stop/route information from sending school as well as a temporary buss pass to use during their assignment

#### **Attendance Coding:**

- New code created to reflect in ISIS student in attendance at the Student Success Center.

#### **Student Success Center Partnering with the One Stop Educational and Community Service Center:**

- Expansion of One Stop Educational and Community Service Center (3 locations, North, Central, South) documents integrated as a geographical referral system to provide families in need with wrap around services.
- Appointed One Stop Liaisons who will be coordinating with geographical SSC locations to enhance offerings of wrap around services

#### **Student Success Coaches**

A uniform training manual has been provided to all Success Coaches. Success Coaches will serve on a rotational schedule to assist with group/individual social and emotional learning. An additional 6 Success Coach positions allocated to better serve students referred.

#### **Parental Components:**

Parent/Guardian Letter (disseminated at student intake): Description of the program and expectations for students.  
Parent Survey: Survey link provided via Parent/Guardian letter or may conduct online survey prior to leaving the SSC.
